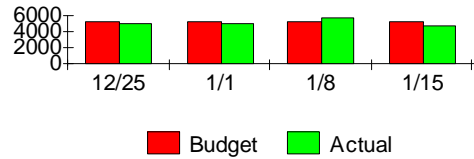

Important Changes to the Most Common Over-the-Counter Medication! Read the Label Carefully! All makers of infant’s acetaminophen (Tylenol) are changing the amount/concentration of acetaminophen in their containers to make the concentration the same in all infant’s and children’s products and to reduce the chance of medication errors, which can be dangerous and even deadly. It is **extremely important** if you are giving this medication to small children and infants. You may have both the old (which is three times more concentrated) and the new formulations in your home. Overdosing your young child is more likely to occur during this period of transition.
