

From the Pastor's Desk

You don't normally think of humor as a faith topic. Humor is a significant part of life and our sense of humor says a lot about us. Like everything else, humor can be used for bad or good purposes.

All of us have poked fun at other people and situations in bad ways. People use humor to put others down, take over control of conversations, or let other people know that their views are superior. Instead of using humor to ease tension and put people at ease, it is used to belittle others and their views. Sarcastic remarks often fall into this category. People can also brutally mock themselves. At first glance, this can look like humility but it can really be a sign of discomfort with yourself or even self-hatred.

Humor definitely has a good side to it and is a gift from God. As stated before, humor is a great way to defuse tension. Nothing loosens people up like finding humor even in a stressful situation. In this way, humor can be a sign of the hope we find in Christ. In good humor we can pick on ourselves and others, but it always takes the other seriously and is a sign of affection. In this way, humor shows true humility and care for others. Even when joking around, we can "love our neighbor as ourselves". We can laugh at faults because we know we are sinners and we know God loves us even in the midst of our weaknesses.

While it would be fruitless to look in the Bible for tips on how to be funny, knowing the forgiveness and love of Christ helps us to use humor properly. With our faith, jokes can be truly funny and for all to enjoy rather than excuses to be mean and put others down. When looking at the world with the eyes of faith, it is clearly seen that God has a great sense of humor.
