



From the Pastor's Desk

This last Thursday began the "Fortnight for Freedom". It is two weeks of prayer, encouraged by the US Catholic Bishops, to pray for religious freedom. The two weeks concludes on the 4th of July. If you forgot or did not know about it, it is not too late to commit some form of prayer, fasting, or charitable work for the cause of religious freedom. Going to our nightly holy hour from 7:30 to 8:30pm is a great way to be a part of it.

It is fitting that the second day of the fortnight (Friday, June 22) was the feast of Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher. They are both examples of people standing up for their religious beliefs in the face of government persecution. Here are their stories:

Saint Thomas More: Thomas More was an English Catholic lawyer who served as Lord Chancellor and a close advisor to King Henry VIII. St. Thomas More opposed the king's separation from the Catholic Church and his naming himself as Supreme Head of the Church of England. More was imprisoned for his refusal to take the oath required by a law that disparaged papal power and required acknowledging the children of Henry and Anne Boleyn (the king's second wife after his divorce from Catherine of Aragon) as legitimate heirs to the throne. In 1535, More was tried for treason, convicted on perjured testimony, and beheaded. He is the patron saint of religious freedom. From the scaffold before his death, Thomas said, "I die the king's servant, and God's first." His story was made into a great movie called, "A Man for All Seasons".

Saint John Fisher: John Fisher was an English Catholic cardinal, academic, and martyr. Fisher was executed by order of King Henry VIII during the English Reformation for refusing to accept the king as Supreme Head of the Church of England and for upholding the Catholic Church's doctrine of papal primacy.

Both of these saints stood up for their faith no matter the consequences. Especially in the face of a US government mandate trying to force Catholic institutions to pay for abortion and contraceptives, we need to stand up for our faith as well. We will probably not be put to death, like Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher, but I pray we have their same faith and courage.

Mary, Thomas More, and John Fisher, pray for us.
