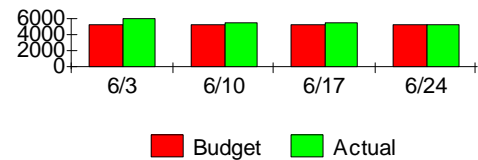

It has been a great time of prayer for religious freedom as the celebration of our country’s independence approaches. If you haven’t come, pick an evening between now and July 4th and join us. We could all use a bit more prayer and quiet anyway. Even outside of the holy hours, I know many of you are praying or doing some form of penance. May God bless our efforts.
