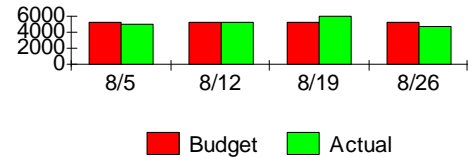

Some issues that can directly affect the Catholic Church in the United States include the redefining of marriage, religious liberty when it comes to our president's health care law, and the constant battle to defend human life in all its stages. **ST. MARY'S CATHOLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL...**

**WHERE FAITH AND KNOWLEDGE MEET**

St. Mary's 5th and 6th graders have a new classroom (the old Kindergarten room) this year and it's full of color and enthusiasm for a fabulous year. We start our day by writing in our journal, teasing our brain, or building a word ladder. We have created big "All About Me" posters to get to know each other and they are displayed in our room. Our Religion studies have begun by teaching us how to know God by His creations all around us and that His Revelation is handed down through Scripture and tradition. We will be familiarizing ourselves with the Old & New Testaments and the books within. Our Grammar lessons are all about nouns this month, while our Reading texts have us reviewing some literary terms, learning new vocabulary, and reading new stories. In addition, we have been listening to the story Frozen Summer by Mary Jane Auch and The Essential 55 which is an award-winning educator's rules for discovering the successful student in every child by Ron Clark. The students enjoy hearing from these two books every morning. Fifth and sixth graders use Writing Our Catholic Faith (a church-based handwriting series) to brush up their cursive. In September, students will be creating a painting from the still-life watermelon drawing they did before they ate some wedges of juicy melon. They'll also draw some other fruits that they can later eat, too, and make themselves a color wheel, which they can use to watercolor paint their drawings.
