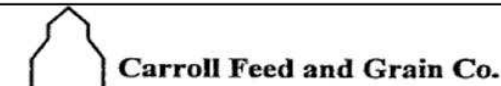

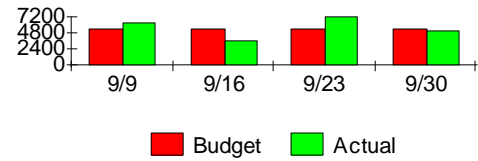

From the Pastor's Desk

I don't know about you, but it seems like the campaign for president has been going on forever. With this in mind, I have some "election encouragements".

1. Try to go to the source. Our TV channels and talk radio stations are full of people talking about what the candidates are saying and doing. However, we only get snippets of what the candidates are actually saying and doing. I want to hear what the candidates have to say and make up my own mind. I hate it when people try to tell me what I should think. How do we hear the candidates themselves rather than commentators? The Internet is one place to see or read speeches without commentary. To use the debates as another example, just watch the debate itself and turn the TV off when the debate is over. This will keep you from listening to the endless analysis afterward. If you are like me, you would rather hear the candidates rather than endless talking about them.

2. Be concerned about where the candidates stand on issues rather than what they say about each other. Like #1, I do not want to be told (even by a candidate) what to think about a person running for the highest office in our country. I want to make up my own mind. The big concern is what the person will do as president. The concern is not what they will think about the other candidate as president. Focus on where the candidates stand on issues rather than their comments about each other.

3. If you don't know what issues to judge candidates on, stick to the most basic ones. For me, I am not an economist or environmental scientist. I do not know how to fix the economy or the secrets to solving global warming. What I do know is that every human life is precious. Therefore I look to abortion as a key issue to see if a candidate shares my values. If a person can't stand up for the most vulnerable people in society--little children in the womb--how can I trust them to stand up for my rights?

There is so much information in the media today. These are 3 ways to help sort through all that information, learn about the candidates and issues out there, and make a prayerful decision on who gets your vote. Prayer is key as well. Pray for the candidates and your fellow voters. May we find the truth in the midst of all the media noise.
