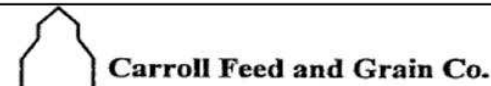

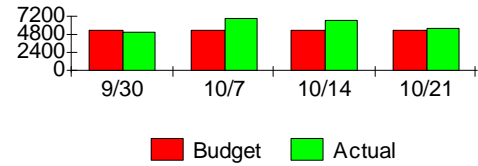

*From the Pastor’s Desk*

With the election coming up on Tuesday, November 6th, I have been thinking a lot. One idea has been coming back to me over and over again:

When I die and go before God, I will have to answer for the things I have done wrong and the good things I failed to do. (Cf. Matthew 25:40) In light of the **millions of children killed by abortion**, I will have to answer for them. Did I do everything I could to save them? Or did I stand by and do nothing?

As our US Catholic bishops point out in their document of Faithful Citizenship, there are more issues than abortion. However, what issue is more important? If we do not have the right to live, then we are heading down a road where any of our rights can be taken away. This sounds extreme but it is true. If the people we look to elect can’t stand up for the unborn, how can we trust them to stand up for us? Some people say they will ignore abortion and vote based on the economy, the environment or other issues (which are important issues). Even some Catholics think this way. In my opinion this would be like voting for Hitler because he has good views on the economy even though I know he is killing millions of Jews. Abortion is not merely one issue among many. It is a matter of life and death for millions of people.

The millions of babies who have been killed will not get to speak out or to vote. We have to be the ones to speak for them. We have to use our vote, our voice, and our prayer to protect them. For this reason, I can’t in good conscience vote for someone who refuses to stand up for the unborn or, even worse, promotes their destruction.

May God help us to protect our brother and sisters in the womb. May the prayers of Mary aid our efforts.
