The great thing about gratitude is that it keeps us humble and stops us from being greedy or selfish. If we are focused on what we DO have, we are not as focused on what we DON'T have.

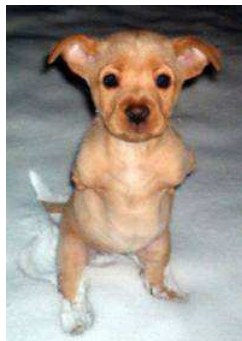

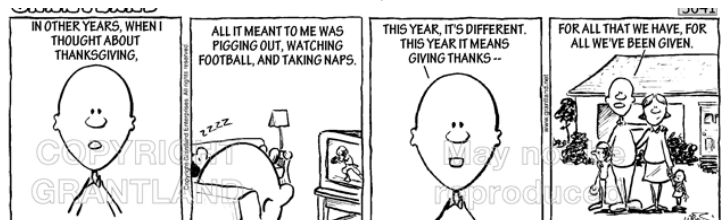
This week's Year of Faith spiritual assignment: Thank God for something (or a few things) each day.
