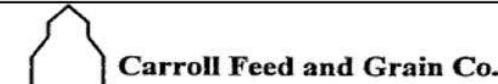

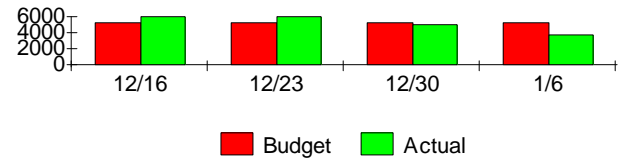

*From the Pastor’s Desk*

This weekend we have our annual collection to support the seminarians of the Archdiocese of Omaha. This coming week is also National Vocations Awareness Week. The collection and focus on vocations brings back a memory of mine and makes me reflect on God’s calling in all of our lives.

The memory that comes to mind is when I was a seminarian. In preparation for this collection to support seminarians, I was asked to speak at all the Masses right here in Wayne. Being a WSC graduate, I had a connection to the parish already. It was one of the first times I ever spoke in front of a church full of people. I was able to share my story of being led to the seminary and asked for your support. Little did I know that I would be the priest here years later.

There are obstacles that stop young men and women from embracing a vocation to the priesthood or religious life. In order to help our young people:

--From a very early age, foster in them a strong sense of prayer. How can a person hear God’s call in their hearts without prayer? They can’t. Our young people are so bombarded by sounds and images that it can be difficult to have a prayerful heart.

--If you sense a young person may be called to a religious vocation, encourage them or ask them to consider it. For example, I remember a great aunt coming up to my twin brother and me asking if we had ever thought of being a priest. It is a small thing but an important thing to be encouraged and asked.

--For my part, I love being a priest and I hope that joy shows. My hope is to be a good model of the priesthood for our young people. Nothing draws people to service in the Church more than a good example. We are blessed in this parish to have great examples in our priests, deacons, and religious sisters.

--Pray for vocations from our parish and for our archdiocese. Never underestimate the power of prayer. Pray. Pray. Pray.

Thanks in advance for your generous support of our seminarians. May we have a parish where people experience God and are able to hear God’s call in their lives.

Mary, Mother of God and our patroness, pray for us.

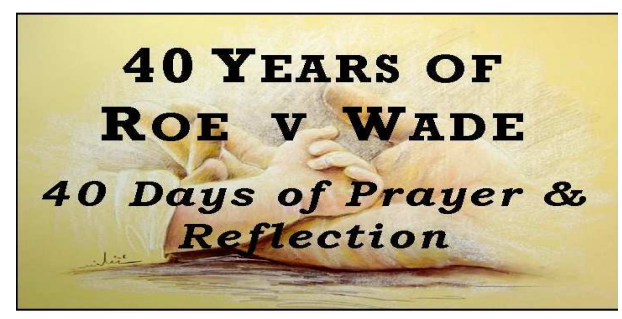
