Make a Gift through an IRA Charitable Rollover

Normally, a distribution from your IRA is taxed as ordinary income. However, "fiscal cliff" tax legislation just enacted extends the opportunity throughout 2013 for individuals 70½ or older to make a direct distribution from your IRA to a qualified charity, such as the Church through your parish, the Archbishop's Annual Appeal, the Omaha Archdiocesan Educational Foundation (OAEF), or other qualified charity without the distribution taxed as income to you. The new law also provides that you may consider such distributions made in January 2013 as made in 2012. In addition, the new law provides a special election available to individuals who took a distribution from their IRA after November 30, 2012 and before January 1, 2013, and who make a gift to a qualified charity before February 1, 2013, to treat the gift as an IRA charitable rollover even though the distribution is not directly from the IRA to charity. From the Pastor's Desk

Tuesday, January 22nd is the 40th anniversary of the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion in our country. The bishops of the United States ask that we do some form of penance that day. You can fast from a meal or TV (for example); do an added form of prayer, or an act of charity for the intention of the defense of the unborn.

With this anniversary coming up in a few days, I saw something in the news this week that got my attention. Thursday morning I was hearing our President talk about gun control in the wake of the horrible shootings in Connecticut. While I know that gun control is a heated topic, something else got my attention. President Obama said that if it is possible to save even one person's life, we need to do it. He was pointing out how every person's life is important.


