





Remember we are walking with Jesus Christ; He may be saying to us, no matter what, **keep your eyes on me**. As your circumstances consume more and more of your attention, you are losing sight of Me. Yet I am with you always (not just sometimes) holding your hand. I am fully aware of your situation, and I will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able to bear. Your gravest danger is worrying about tomorrow. It is in the present moment I walk close to you, helping you carry your burdens. Keep you focus on My Presence in the present. Keep your eyes on me!

"Discerning the Prayer of Lent" with Rev. Thomas A. Greisen will be Saturday, March 9, 9:00-11:00 a.m. at the Immaculata Monastery & Spirituality Center in Norfolk. This Lenten reflection time we will take our childhood explanations of the purpose of Lent to a richer, deeper level by examining some of the wisdom from our biblical texts and liturgical prayer in hopes that we will know the prayer of Lent that cries in our beings inside or outside of the Church's liturgical season of 40-days. Cost \$10.

### From the Pastor's Desk

With Pope Benedict resigning this past week, here are some of the things I will remember about this time as the successor of Peter as the Bishop of Rome:

--I was at World Youth Day in Cologne, Germany in 2005. If you don't know what World Youth Day is, it is a huge gathering of young Catholics that takes place every two or three years. What made this one special was that Pope Benedict had been elected Pope earlier in 2005 and here he was returning to his home country of Germany for the first time. While I did not get to see the Pope in person at this event (a very long story), it was great to be in Germany and be a part of it.

--His first Encyclical (major writing to the Church) was called "Deus Caritas Est" ("God is Love"). Pope Benedict is a world-renowned theologian and his previous job in the Vatican was to safeguard true Catholic teaching. Many people thought his first written document would be about correcting theological errors or about very technical theological issues. Instead, he reminded the world that God is love and that our faith is primarily about having a relation with God through Christ.

--I remember his visit to the United States in April 2008. I was able to watch some of it on TV as he had a big Mass at the baseball stadium in Washington, DC and visited the 9/11 Memorial in New York City. It was the first time I was able to see him upclose, even if it was on a TV screen. He came across to me as a truly humble man, almost embarrassed by all of the attention he received but knowing that he was only getting the attention because of his connection with Jesus and the Church.

--During his vacations, Pope Benedict did something truly unprecedented in the history of the Church. He wrote a great theological work while being Pope. No Pope had done that since most of the time they are busy with all of their responsibilities. He ended up writing a series of book about Jesus, called Jesus of Nazareth. The last part of the series came out this past December. They will be a benefit to the Church for generations to come.

--Lastly, I will remember his humility in resigning from the office of Pope. He had the courage to look honestly at himself, his physical health, and the needs of the Church and prayerfully decide to step down. Considering this is pretty unheard of in the history of the Church, it took some courage to do it.

Mary, Mother of God, pray for us and Pope-emeritus Benedict XVI.
