



I remember having the Bible I got for Confirmation in a bin in my college dorm room. Honestly, the first 3 years of college, it just sat there. When my faith awakened, I found myself digging around to find it. I was glad someone gave one to me. You never know when a person will be drawn to the Word of God.
- 2. **A Crucifix**. Every Catholic's room should have a crucifix. It is a visible reminder of the love of God. A crucifix is like a summary of our faith in one simple image. These also make for good wedding presents, along with being great for high school and college graduates.
- 3. **A good book**. Whether it be a religious classic, like The Imitation of Christ or The Story of a Soul, or a book like Catholicism for Dummies, every Catholic could use another good religious book.
- 4. **Have a Mass said for them**. Going to your local parish and having a Mass said for their intention is always a good idea. Never underestimate the power of prayer.


