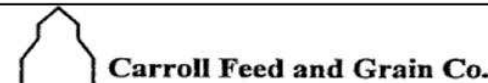

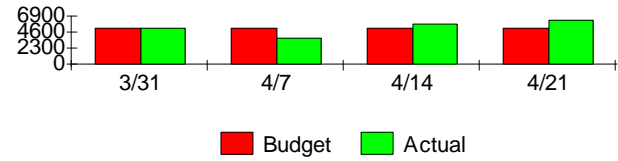

In the coming weeks, many of you will celebrate relatives and friends graduating from high school or college. Do you ever wonder about faith-related gifts for them? Here are a few ideas for you if you do.

1. **A Bible.** Even if the graduate does not read the Bible regularly (if ever), it is still a good thing for them to have. I remember having the Bible I got for Confirmation in a bin in my college dorm room. Honestly, the first 3 years of college, it just sat there. When my faith awakened, I found myself digging around to find it. I was glad someone gave one to me. You never know when a person will be drawn to the Word of God.

2. **A Crucifix.** Every Catholic's room should have a crucifix. It is a visible reminder of the love of God. A crucifix is like a summary of our faith in one simple image. These also make for good wedding presents, along with being great for high school and college graduates.

3. **A good book.** Whether it be a religious classic, like The Imitation of Christ or The Story of a Soul, or a book like Catholicism for Dummies, every Catholic could use another good religious book.

4. **Have a Mass said for them.** Going to your local parish and having a Mass said for their intention is always a good idea. Never underestimate the power of prayer.

5. **Information on the local Newman Center or Church.** Often graduates will be going to a city that they don't know particularly well. In the card, you can include some information on the local church where they will be living or the Catholic Center at the college they will attend.

These are some gift suggestions for you. Graduation is a time of transition. Giving a reminder of God and their Catholic faith can help during their time of change.
