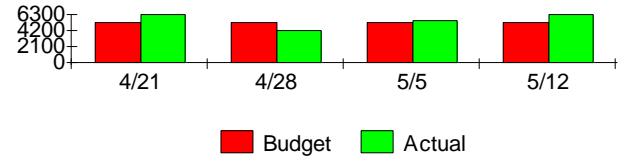

*From the Pastor’s Desk*

There are prayers we say so often that we fail to realize what these prayers really mean. In this month dedicated to Mary, the Hail Mary is one of these prayers. Let us reflect a little more on what this prayer is all about.

The first half of the Hail Mary expresses the joy of heaven and earth at the incarnation of Jesus. “Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee” (Lk 1:28) is the greeting of the archangel Gabriel when he announces that Mary will be the mother of Jesus. “Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus” (Lk 1:42) is the greeting of Elizabeth when Mary, pregnant with Jesus, visits her. So in this first half of the Hail Mary we are joining in the praise of heaven (represented by the archangel Gabriel) and earth (represented by Elizabeth). When you say those words, do you realize that you are sharing in the praise of heaven and earth to God for the fact that Jesus has become man?

Notice how the name of Jesus is the center of the Hail Mary. Yes, the prayer is directed to Mary but Jesus is at the heart of it, just as Jesus is at the center of Mary’s heart. If someone asks you why you pray to Mary, tell him or her that you are asking Mary to pray for you and that turning to Mary always means having Mary direct us towards Jesus.

The rest of the Hail Mary is basically asking Mary, the Mother of God, to pray for us. In the time of Jesus, the queen of a kingdom was not the wife of the king because the king normally had many wives. The queen was the king’s mother and the role of the Queen Mother was to intercede for the people to the king. Mary is our Queen Mother who intercedes for us in a special way with her Son. If you ever wonder how powerful Mary’s intercession is, see the story of the Wedding Feast of Cana (Jn 2:1-12).

So the next time you say the Hail Mary, take the time to think about the words you are praying. It is a powerful prayer and Mary is a powerful intercessor.

Mary, Mother of God and our patroness, pray for us.
