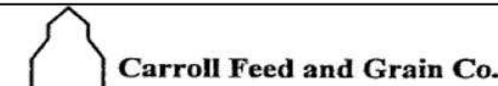

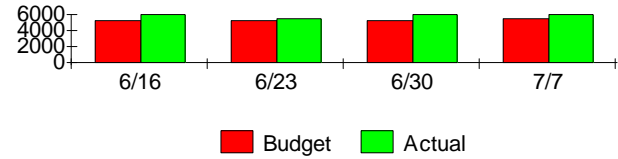

From the Pastor’s Desk

On Friday, July 5th, Pope Francis put out his first encyclical letter. An encyclical letter is a message from the Pope to the Church. Pope Francis’ first encyclical is entitled, “The Light of Faith” (“Lumen Fidei” in Latin). Over the next few weeks I will be reflecting on this encouraging letter.

From the very outset, Pope Francis is open about the fact that faith is seen as unimportant by many people today. In fact, the whole letter is about combatting this idea. Along with Pope Francis, I would content that faith is more important than ever!

Some people think that we are too advanced to believe in God anymore. Faith is no longer relevant. Others may contend that faith really has no rational basis and instead is merely something that makes people feel good. Others may see faith as just the opinion of some individuals. Since, in this view, it is simply an opinion, faith cannot be truly shared or talked about as being true or false. All of these viewpoints see faith as ultimately unimportant.

Do you see this attitude among many in our society? I have people in my family who think it is “nice” that I’m a priest, but they don’t see why anyone would dedicate their lives to God or even waste time by going to Church on Sundays. In the US, people even want to get faith out of the public eye. By not allowing prayer in schools or copies of the Ten Commandments in public places, aren’t we saying that faith is not important anymore?

Along with Pope Francis, I see faith as something vitally important. Our faith in Jesus shows us how precious we are to God, how we are called to live for God rather than for our selfish desires, and our faith calls us to be generous to the poor. Jesus is truly the “light” that shows us what life is all about.

Without faith, we are like cars without a steering wheel. We don’t have a purpose and direction. Our motor might be running, the radio might be on, but we have no place to go. We are alive, but without any ultimate goal. Without meaning and purpose in our lives, we end up lost, alone, empty, and in despair. That is not truly living.

May the vital importance of faith be rekindled by the “light of faith” in Jesus. Mary, Jesus’ first disciple and our patroness, pray for us.

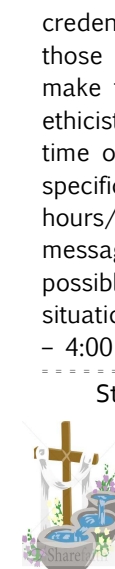
