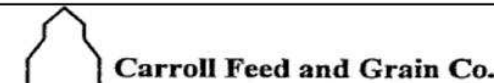

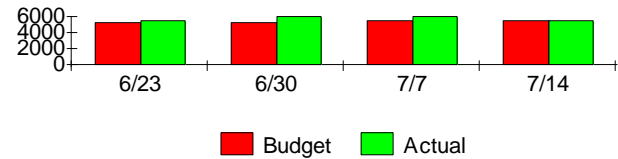

*From the Pastor’s Desk*

I continue to reflect on Pope Francis’ first encyclical called, “The Light of Faith” (“Lumen Fidei”, in Latin). This week I want to reflect on the first definition of faith found in this document.

“Faith is born of an encounter with the living God who calls us and reveals His love which precedes us and upon which we can lean for security and for building our lives”. (Paragraph 4)

First of all, faith starts with an encounter. Think of the first time you met your husband or wife. Remember the first time you held your newborn child. Have you and I encountered God in this way? For a lot of Catholics, we see faith as a set of rules to be followed. However, the heart of faith is a relationship with God. Do we remember the more powerful times when we experienced God alive and present to us in the same way that we remember meeting that husband, wife, or newborn child? Also, do we talk to God every day? Do we have a daily relationship with Jesus? This daily walk with Jesus is the heart of our faith.

This definition of faith also tells us about the God that we hopefully encounter in nature, in the people we meet every day, in art and music, in daily prayer, in the Scriptures, and in the sacraments of the Church. We believe in a “living God”. Jesus is risen and alive, which is why we can have a friendship with Him. God wants a relationship with us, which is why He “calls us”. Over time, God “reveals” who He is with the full revealing of God being done in Jesus, God made man. Finally, we come to realize that “His love” is more than we can even imagine and in which we can trust with our lives.

Our faith involves going to Mass on Sundays, devotions like the Rosary, and church programs such as Religious Education for our kids. However, at the heart of our faith is an encounter with God. In fact, it is only in light of this relationship with Jesus that all the activities of the Church make sense. If our faith life is “going through the motions” or a “spiritual to-do list”, take a fresh look at what faith is supposed to be.
