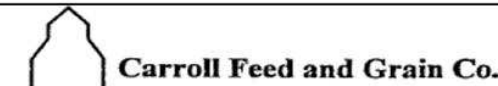

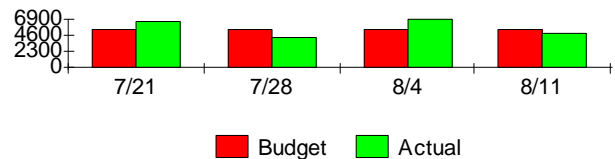

From the Pastor’s Desk

With the new school year in mind, I have a few prayers/wishes for our students:

1. Focus on growing in your faith along with excelling in your classes. “For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?” (Mk 8:36) What good is it to get all A’s, excel in activities, and have a social life if you lose God along the way? Take at least a bit of quiet time each day and ask yourself where you experienced God. This will help connect your daily life to your life with God.

2. For older students, stay away from the traps that seem to surround you. Alcohol, drugs, and sex don’t bring happiness. They only lead to regrets that may last a lifetime. Also, be a good friend by helping others to stay away from these traps too. Personally, I am tired of seeing so many alcohol-related offenses in the newspaper. Don’t add to that list. Each day is a gift and your life is too precious.

3. Do your best! There are a lot of influences asking you to give less than your best. It may come in the form of peer pressure or lack of self-confidence. Some movies and shows even glamorize living a lazy and selfish lifestyle. Pursue excellence! As Jesus said, “You, therefore, must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.” (Mt 5:48) The goal of the Christian life is not to do as little as possible or just to get by. Our goal is nothing less than to be with God in heaven where there is perfect happiness and goodness, nothing less.

For any students reading this short list, don’t see it as the old-fashioned advice of some priest. See it as words of encouragement from someone who cares and has often learned these lessons the hard way. Just as people call me “Father”, I write this out of fatherly care.
