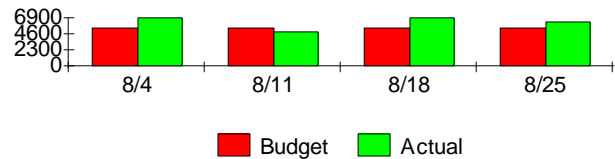

From the Pastor’s Desk

I write this article on the 50th anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King’s “I Have a Dream” speech. To renew your memory, here is the part of the speech that brought about its title:

“I say to you today my friends -- so even though we face the difficulties of today and tomorrow, I still have a dream. It is a dream deeply rooted in the American dream. I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal." ... I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character. I have a dream today”

In some ways, this dream has been realized through the desegregation of schools and workplaces, equal voting rights for all, and other reforms. There is a lot to celebrate.

At the same time, there is still work to be done to make Dr. King’s “dream” come alive. We still need to try to make sure racism in all its forms are not in our hearts or our country’s social structures.

I also want to point out how Dr. King’s faith, as a Christian minister, inspired everything he stood for. All men and women are created equal in the eyes of God. Also, Jesus died so that all might have their sins forgiven and know the eternal embrace of God. The Christian faith is the most powerful expression of equality and human dignity EVER! I pray that our country will not stray too far away from God, because then we would lose sight of the Christian ideals that make true equality and Dr. King’s “dream” possible.

Mary, the Immaculate Conception, patron saint of our country, pray for us.
