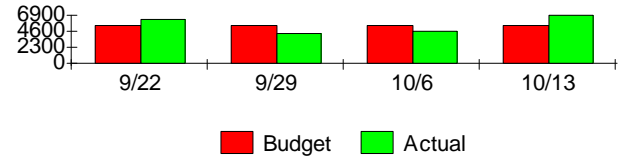

*From the Pastor's Desk*

In this month of the Rosary it might be helpful to address some misconceptions about this great devotion. This is inspired by an article by Kevin Orlin Johnson.

Misconception 1: “The Rosary is for old people”. The fact is that the rosary started and continued as a prayer for families. It is a great way for families to pray together, teach children the classic prayers of the Church, and learn about the mysteries of Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection. As the saying goes, “A family, who prays together, stays together”.

Misconception 2: “It’s just repeating prayers over and over”. When prayed improperly, it can be mere repetition. Prayed properly, the repeating of prayers is not an end in itself. Rather, the prayers prepare our minds to meditate on the mysteries of the Rosary.

Misconception 3: “The beads are just superstition”. The focus of the Rosary is not the beads. The beads are just an aid to prayer. In fact, you do not need beads at all to pray it. Often while driving or going for a walk, I will just use my fingers to count the Hail Mary’s. The rosary is a prayer, first and foremost. The beads are merely an aid to prayer.

Misconception 4: “It is not in the Bible”. Yes, it is. Devotional prayer is all over the Bible. For example, Jews and Christians would gather for prayer several times a day (Acts 3:1, 10:9,30 are examples). Plus, the prayers of the Rosary are Biblical. The Our Father is given to us by Jesus and the Hail Mary quotes Gabriel the Archangel and Elizabeth. The mysteries themselves are meditations on scriptural events.

Misconception 5: “I can be a perfectly good Christian without the Rosary”. This is true. Jesus did not require praying the Rosary to be saved. However, we are asked by Jesus to pray often (like He did). To know and love Jesus, we need to meditate frequently on his life, death and resurrection. The Rosary is a great way to do that. You can be a good Christian without the Rosary, but if you are looking for a great way to become a good Christian, the Rosary is a great place to start.

Mary, Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us.
