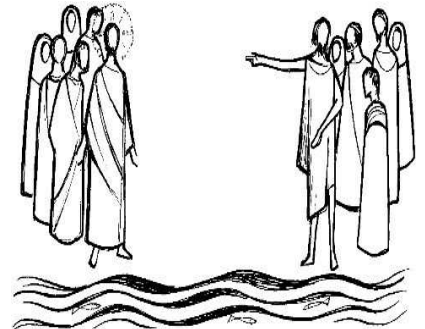
SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Celebrated individually upon request. If someone is seriously ill, please call the rectory.

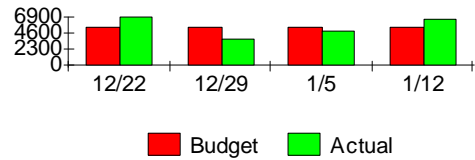

From the Pastor’s Desk

At the Masses this weekend, you will see a video about the “Ignite the Faith Campaign”. Archbishop Lucas has asked us to be a part of this along with every parish in the Archdiocese of Omaha. I see this campaign as a gift.

This campaign will help our parish in a few exciting ways. 40% of what we raise will come back to our school building. It will be used to update the electrical system (which is from when the school was built 60 years ago) and potentially add a new heating and air conditioning system. With the number of school kids doubling in the last 6 years (Yes, DOUBLING!) and with us not even having enough room for all of our Religious Education classes on Wednesday nights, this project will set that building up to be used more year-around and able to support technology changes into the future.

The 10% coming back to the parish will be used to do something with the entryway of the church. We have not decided exactly what to do in the entryway, but there are desires to make the bathroom handicap accessible along with widening and enclosing to entryway to provide more space.

Outside of these two great opportunities for our parish, there are also a few spiritual gifts that could come from the “Ignite the Faith Campaign”. First, we are reminded of our connection to the wider Church. We can accomplish things as an Archdiocese that no one parish could do on our own. Plus, we are part of the larger Body of Christ, the Church, which spans the entire world and even all the angels and saints in heaven. This is also a chance to support our retired priest who have served us and God so faithful and support our seminarians. Second, this campaign is a challenge. Every challenge is an opportunity to trust in Jesus. We have to trust that Jesus, who has provided for our parish for over 130 years, will continue to provide for us and help us not only to keep going but to grow, thrive, and touch even more hearts with the love of God.

I encourage you to see this campaign as a true gift. I do. Mary, Mother of God and patroness of our parish, pray for us.
