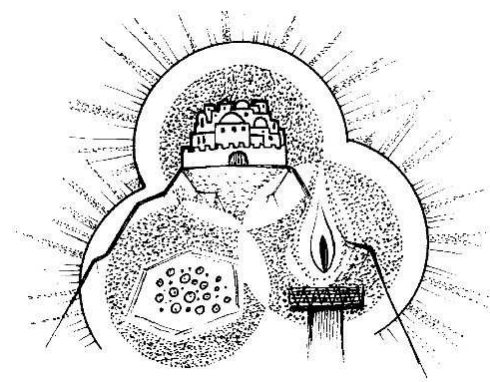
SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Celebrated individually upon request. If someone is seriously ill, please call the rectory.

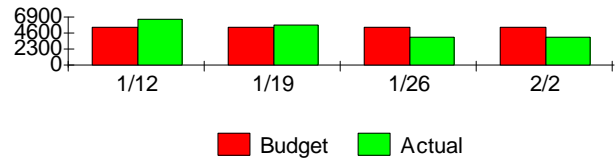

From the Pastor's Desk

In this article, I continue to explain as much as I can about the “Ignite the Faith” capital campaign for the Archdiocese of Omaha. Here are some questions I have been asked lately, along with my best attempts to answer them.

Why not donate directly to St. Mary's instead of to the Archdiocese? I like the desire of parishioners to contribute to our parish needs, but we need to think beyond our parish boundaries. This campaign will be a great benefit to our parish. However, there are some needs that can only be taken care of by all the parishes in the area working together. We need to think especially of our retired priests and seminarians, who sacrifice for all of the parishes in northeast Nebraska.

I think there is a spiritual benefit to contributing to causes that are not only local. Jesus started the Church and prayed that we might all be one. We are connected to the Archdiocese and, through the Archbishop, to the Catholic Church throughout the world. We are part of something so much bigger than our parish! We are a part of the Body of Christ, which encompasses all of the members of the Church, today and in the past. We are part of something truly big and important. This campaign can remind us of this spiritual reality. So while contributing to St. Mary's is a wonderful thing to do, we also need to realize we are part of something much bigger than our parish.

There is also a practical benefit to being a part of the Archdiocesan campaign. We get the benefits of the professionals who help run the campaign without St. Mary's needing to hire them. The Archdiocese provides us with a lot of support through the Steier Group and the Archdiocese's Stewardship and Development Office. We get the support of a professional campaign without needing to hire them and coordinate it all ourselves. It is all taken care of for us. Personally, I am grateful for that.

Continue to prayerfully consider what you can give to the campaign over the next 3 years.
