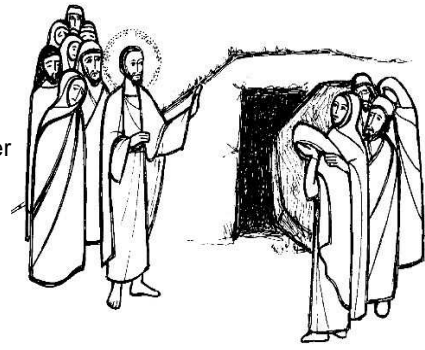
SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Celebrated individually upon request. If someone is seriously ill, please call the rectory.

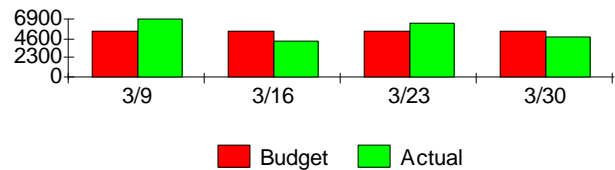

News and Notes From the Pastor’s Desk

Last week, Pope Francis surprised everyone in attendance at an event. He has become famous for doing the unexpected sometimes. This time, he was presiding at a ceremony to kick off 24 hours of Confessions at St. Peter’s Basilica in Rome. What broke normal protocol was the fact that Pope Francis himself was the first person to go to Reconciliation/Confession. It was the first time I have ever seen a picture of the Pope going to Confession. Popes go to Confessions regularly, of course, but this is the first time the world has seen it.

If nothing else, this should encourage all of us to take advantage of this wonderful sacrament of God’s forgiveness. If the Pope goes, so should we. The Pope is a sinner, just like us. This surprise from Pope Francis should also give us a few reminders about Confession.

It is for EVERYONE. Even Popes, bishops, and priests go to Confession. Believe it or not, even I go to Confession.

Confession is good for you even if you haven’t done anything “major”. It is safe to assume that Pope Francis has not murdered anyone, robbed a bank, or driven a car while drunk, but he still went to the sacrament. Even our sins that seem small--like lying, failing to pray, or being impatient with people — separate us from God. So if you don’t have any mortal sins, it is still good to confess our venial sins regularly.



Let Pope Francis be an example for us when it comes to going to Confession. Mary, Mother of God and the patroness of our parish, pray for us.
