

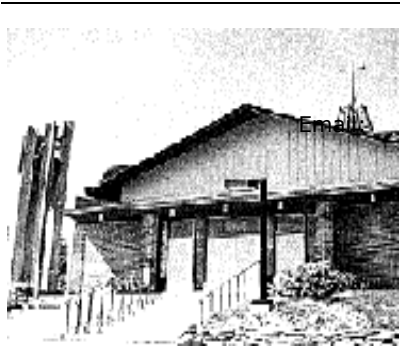

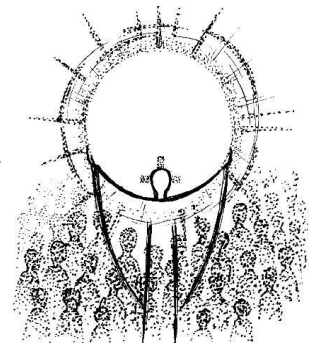

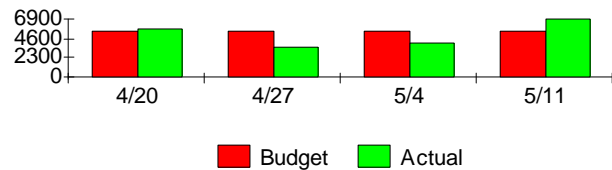

News and Notes from the Pastor’s Desk

Last week I started a series of article on the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy. If you don’t remember, these are seven ways to take care of the physical needs of people and thereby show them the love of Jesus. The Seven Corporal Works of Mercy are to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, care for the sick, visit the imprisoned and bury the dead. Last week I reflected on feeding the hungry and giving drink to the thirsty. This week my reflection is on clothing the naked.

When I think of clothing the naked, my first instinct is to thank God that there are no naked people walking around our community. I have this image that clothing the naked means to help people with no clothes at all. However, this work of mercy is about more than that. You may not see people walking around naked, but how many people in our community don’t have enough warm clothes to deal with the winter cold? Ask any school teacher and they will tell you that they know kids who don’t have a good winter coat.

We spend so much time and money trying to keep up with current fashions and wearing the right brand names while many people struggle to clothe their kids. There is nothing wrong with fashion and looking good, but we do need to be aware of putting too much focus on our physical appearances or ignoring that there are people who don’t have this luxury. Included in this is not to judge people too much by what they wear either. How often do we look down on people because they don’t have the best clothes? It is never OK to look down on people.

In our community, I think of Micah’s Closet, run by the Methodist Church. This is a great service to our community by giving people a place where they can find clothes at a cheap price.

When was the last time you went through your closet and took out all of the clothes that you have not worn in a year or more? Do you have clothes that you know you will never wear again? Donating clothes to Micah’s Closet or some other organization is a great way to “clothe the naked” and free up some space in your house.

I think of Jesus being stripped of His garments before being nailed to the wood of the cross. He knows what it is like to go without the clothes he needed. Many people share in that pain. I pray we do what we can to help these people, because when we do we are helping Jesus.

Mary, Mother of the Poor, pray for us.
