**COLLEGE STUDENTS & VISITORS:** We welcome you and pray that you will feel at home worshipping with us.

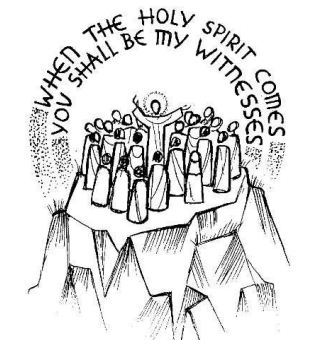

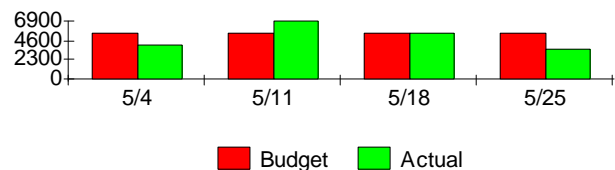

*News and Notes from the Pastor’s Desk*

I continue a series of articles on the 7 corporal works of mercy. This week’s work of mercy is sheltering the homeless.

Jesus knows what it is like to be homeless. He had no permanent place to live since He went from town to town curing the sick and teaching people about the kingdom of God. Even when he was born, Joseph and Mary had a hard time finding a place to stay in Bethlehem. Shortly after He was born, Joseph had to take Him and Mary to Egypt to save His life. Jesus knows what it is like to have no place to call home.

Is homelessness an issue in our country? According to the National Alliance to End Homeless, there are about 640,000 people experiencing homelessness on any given night in our country. Of that number, about 222,000 are people in families, and 388,000 are individuals. About 18 percent of the homeless population - 109,000 - are considered "chronically homeless," and about 9 percent of homeless adults- 58,000 - are veterans.

It is one thing to realize that people are homeless in our country, but what about our local community? There are plenty of people who struggle to keep a roof over their heads. While you may not see people sleeping on the streets, that doesn’t mean that people are not homeless or on the brink of being homeless. All you have to do is ask Deacon Pat Gross, who does the poor ministry for the Wayne churches, and he can tell you stories of people needing temporary or permanent housing.

One effort in our area to help people get affordable housing is Habitat for Humanity. It is an organization that has built a few houses in our community for families who might never have a decent house otherwise. In fact, one Habitat for Humanity house is being built right now in Wayne. Through Habitat for Humanity and other efforts, homeless can be lessened, if not eliminated.

Don’t we all yearn for a place to call “home”? As Christians, it is a reminder that the true home we long for is heaven. May was work to make sure people have homes here on earth and do what we can to help each other reach our ultimate home in heaven.

Mary, Queen of Heaven, pray for us.
