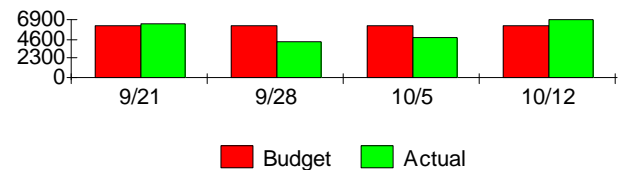

News and Notes from the Pastor’s Desk

I read an article this week by George Weigel called, “The Chattering Classes are Us”. He writes about how treating the church as a sacred space and the tradition of silence in church has been lost. It reads:

“To enter a church, especially in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, was to enter a different kind of environment, one of the hallmarks of which was a reverent silence. Some of that intuition remains. But much of it has been lost.”

Some noise in Church is unavoidable. Young children will cry sometimes. People will move and get restless sometimes. Things get dropped. Bathroom doors get opened and closed. [Going to bathroom in the middle of Mass is an issue for another article.] All of these noises and many others are unavoidable. My suggestion for these noises is to use them to motivate you to pray. Especially when noises are really distracting you or annoying you, offer your small suffering up as a prayer. If you see a family with a small child who is struggling, pray for them. Whatever you do, try not to stare at people making this noise. This only embarrasses the family, possibly makes them less likely to attend Mass, and can cause other people to be distracted and look over there too.

Outside of these unavoidable sounds, I encourage all of us to keep the church as silent and prayerful as possible. Here are a few reminders on how to do that:

1. Avoid unnecessary conversations in church.
2. Turn your cell phone off or leave it in the car so it is not a distraction for you. The ringing of a phone is disturbing to people.
3. Avoid using the restroom during Mass. Go before Mass or hold it, if possible. Of course, this is not possible for young kids.
4. Truly pray before, during and after Mass. If we are talking to God, we won’t be talking to each other. Talking to God is more important, anyway.

Silence gives us the space to pray, to hear God stirring in our hearts, and experience God present to us.

Mary, the Mother of God, pray for us.

Why School Choice

School Choice breeds competition. Competition is embraced in nearly every aspect of society. Competition often improves products, makes systems more efficient, and allows citizens to express their right to choose. Education, however, has not embraced competition. Milton Friedman, one of our country’s earliest school choice advocates, argued that our government needs to stop financing schools and start financing students (Friedman, 2013, p. 2). He further argued that our current system of education in America is one that deprives itself of the benefits of competition (Friedman, 2013, p. 2). Nationwide, the shuttering of Catholic schools in the past 15 years has cost the taxpayer more than \$20 billion dollars, as public schools, many with overcrowding issues, have to incur the added cost of educating this influx of students (Hamilton, 2008, p. 5). Based on legislative design, school choice can save the taxpayer money in addition to addressing the social justice argument. To be continued...
