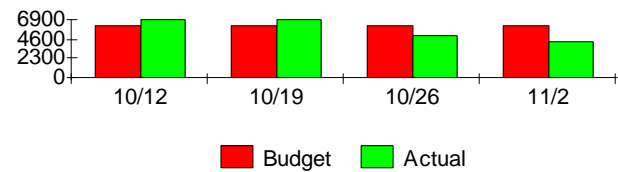

*News and Notes from the Pastor’s Desk*

This coming Tuesday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, is Veteran’s Day. With this in mind, I thought I would reflect on this occasion for a moment.

In case you did not know, I am a veteran. I served as a Nebraska Army National Guard chaplain from August 2004 until July 2008. I even did a tour in Iraq from September 2006 to August 2007.

While I miss the opportunity to serve the men and women of the military, I am proud that I had the opportunity to serve our country.

The motto of the Army chaplain core is, “Pro Deo et Patria” (“For God and Country”). These are very fitting words to describe the ministers who serve our military as chaplains. The role of a chaplain is a unique one. A chaplain never carries a weapon, is an officer who has no real authority to give orders in battle, and whose job is to take care of those who take care of our country. Instead of a rank on my hat, there would be a cross. Instead of fighting the enemy, the chaplain counsels people, provides what they need to practice their faith, and provides religious information to the commander.

My year in Iraq was the busiest, most tiring, and most rewarding year of my life. While visiting soldiers in the hospital, counseling them on problems at home and in country, traveling throughout Iraq all the time because of the small number of Catholic priests in the military, and even honoring 4 men from our battalion who died was difficult, it was also the greatest honor of my life.

God bless our country, our veterans and their families, those currently serving, especially far from home.

**WHERE FAITH AND KNOWLEDGE MEET**

Academic Research Aiding the Call for School Choice as a Reform Measure

- Academic proficiency of America’s elementary and high school (K-12) students is staggeringly low compared to other industrialized countries (McKinsey, 2009).
- Despite countless reform efforts in recent decades, the performance of American students continues to worsen relative to students in other developed countries (McKinsey, 2009, p. 3).
- The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) is the “largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what America’s students know and can do in various subject areas” (NCES, 2014) and is a partner with the US Department of Education.
- NAEP data highlights a two to three year learning disadvantage between black and Latino students compared to their white peers (McKinsey, 2009, p. 9).
- In addition, NAEP data shows a similar two year disadvantage (achievement gap) between poverty students and non-poverty students (McKinsey, 2009, p.12). (cont.)
