*News and Notes from the Pastor's Desk*

One of the most heart-wrenching parts of my job is dealing with situations regarding divorce. My heart goes out to every person and family going through it. With Pope Francis and the recent Synod on the Family, it has brought the Catholic Church, divorce, annulments, and remarriage into the public eye.

When addressing marriage issues, there are two main concerns: 1. To stay faithful to the teachings of Jesus and 2. To have a heart for those who are struggling, like Jesus does.

1. When I stand at the altar with a couple getting married, the high point of the celebration is when they recite their vows to each other. Right after the vows, I quote the words of Jesus, “What God has joined together, no human being must separate” (Matthew 19:6).

The Church wants to stay faithful to the words of Jesus. To be released of vows should be a decision the Church takes very seriously. This is why the annulment process is one that strives to take marriage vows seriously and yet look for ways a marriage might be able to be annulled. Since “no human being must separate” the marriage bond, in the annulment process the Church looks for factors that would have gotten in the way of that bond forming. Some factors that could make a marriage eligible for an annulment can be things like being very young, mental illness, addictions, or not being open to children.

2. We need to have the heart of Jesus for those going through divorce. I think of Jesus and the woman caught in adultery (John 8:1-11). Jesus said to her, “Neither do I condemn you. Go, [and] from now on do not sin anymore.” He did not judge her or condemn her. Sadly, people going through divorce sometimes feel judged or condemned by a priest or people in their parish. This should NEVER be the case! That is not acting like Jesus! With this compassion in mind, I know Pope Francis wants to streamline and simplify the annulment process in some way.

These are the two concerns that Pope Francis and the Catholic Church are trying to balance. Pray for Pope Francis and the bishops as they discern God's will in these areas. Pray that they will stay faithful to the teachings of Jesus and have the love and compassion of Jesus' Sacred Heart.

Mary, Mother of the Church, pray for us.

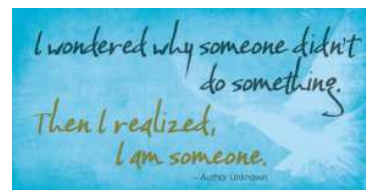

Academic Research Aiding the Call for School Choice as a Reform Measure · In a further analysis of this NAEP data, McKinsey (2009) argued that these achievement gaps lead to an “underutilization of human potential” which leads to lower earnings, reduced health, and increased incarceration (p. 5). They further argue that if our country could replicate a smaller achievement gap as found in countries such as Finland or Korea, the impact on better utilization of human potential would yield a higher Gross Domestic Product in America in the amounts of \$1.3-\$2.3 trillion dollars (McKinsey, 2009, p. 5). · According to NAEP data, Nebraska realizes larger achievement gaps in a majority of measured categories relative to national averages (Nation's Report Card, 2013). In addition, a 2009 study by the US Department of Education revealed that Nebraska demonstrated the largest achievement gap for African American eighth graders in overall academic proficiency (Platte Institute, 2013, para. 8). · Data/Research is abundant to show that achievement gaps in private schools are significantly smaller.
