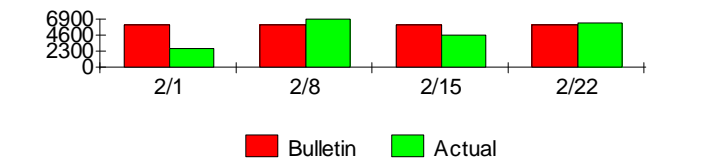

News and Notes from the Pastor’s Desk

In my opinion, this is the toughest part of Lent. We have probably been doing penance 1 1/2 weeks now, the initial energy is waning, and we might have already fallen or even given up. Here are some suggestions for you and me at this time in Lent.

1. If you have fallen or quit your acts of penance, start again. There is no prize for having a perfect Lent. The goal is to grow in our faith and it is never too late to start doing that. God even wants to use our falls to draw us closer to Him. Our failures keep us humble and make us turn to God for help.
2. Maybe the penance you gave yourself was too difficult. You might want to try simplifying it. It is better to do a few things for God very well than to fail doing too much. On the other hand, whatever you are doing for Lent might have been too easy. You can always reevaluate and do more.
3. Some people merely give things up for Lent. Do something for your spiritual growth and it might help you. As you grow closer to God, giving up candy, pop, or whatever will take on a deeper meaning. The Stations of the Cross on Fridays (7pm) or spending time in adoration in church is a nice place to start. If we are not careful, our sacrifices can make us more selfish because we are focused on what we gave up. Prayer, along with generous acts for others, brings us out of ourselves to be more focused on God and other people.
4. Confession. What greater place is there to go when we fall in sinful ways? It is a great place to get a fresh start and Lent is the perfect time to go. Especially if you haven’t gone to confession in a while, make Lent a time to change that. Reconciliation times include: Thursdays from 5:45-6:45pm, Saturdays from 4:30 to 5:45pm, 30 minutes before each weekend Mass, and immediately after Mass. If none of those times work for you, you can always call me and make an appointment.
5. If you are really struggling with your Lenten practices, have a friend or family member that you talk to about it regularly. This gives you some accountability and allows someone to encourage you when needed. These are a few tips to get us through the toughest part of Lent. God bless.
