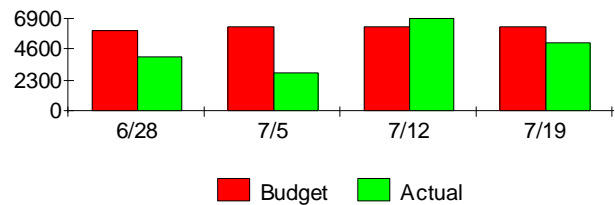

News and Notes from the Pastor’s Desk

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the most powerful prayer we have where we participate in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. It is the most powerful form of prayer and the one we tend to take for granted the most. With this in mind, here are a few suggests on how all of us can get more out of Mass:

1. Before Mass take a minute or two and ask the Holy Spirit for whom or for what you want to offer your prayer of the Mass. Having this intention helps to give us focus. By offering the Mass as a prayer for a loved one who is sick, a deceased family member, or a need in our world makes us want to pay attention and pray with more ardor. We are not just a person sitting in a pew but an active participant uniting our needs with the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross.
2. As the readings are being proclaimed, try to listen attentively and pay attention to what strikes your heart. A word, phrase, or an entire reading may touch you. Do those words challenge you, encourage you, or fill you with questions? When you get a chance, pray about what struck your heart. Bringing a small note pad to Mass to write down the words or passage could help with this. Praying on the readings throughout the week helps with this too. By doing this, you are allowing God to speak to you through the readings. The readings will go from something to sit through to being an encounter with God where your heart is open to what He wants to say to you.
3. After Mass, instead of immediately rushing out the door to sporting events, a meal, or the rest of your Sunday plans, take a moment and ask the Holy Spirit to show you something from the Mass that you want to hold onto. This can be a line from a song, an idea from the homily, or a few words from a prayer of the Mass. A nice way for the family to do this is to take a few minutes in the car on your drive home to allow everyone to share what spoke to each of you at the Mass. This allows us to take something home from the Mass and therefore opens us up to the transforming power of Jesus in the Mass. The graces of the Mass can touch us even after we leave the physical church. This also connects the Mass with the rest of our day and week.

These are just a few simple ways to get more out of the Mass. God wants to touch our hearts, but we have to have minds and hearts open to it.

Mary, Mother of God and our patroness, pray for us.
