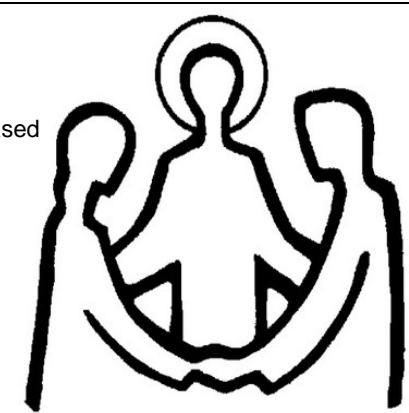

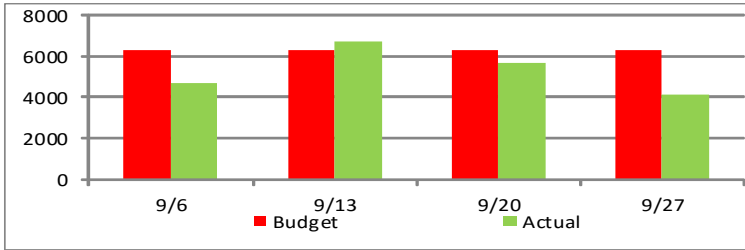

News and Notes from the Pastor’s Desk

In the Church, the month of October is a time to remember and appreciate the Rosary. It has become the most visible symbol of being Catholic. What makes the Rosary so important and where did it come from?

The Rosary began to develop in the first centuries after the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. At first, people wanted to model the prayer of the monks who prayed all 150 Psalms each day. Since people could not read and could not pray with the monks because of their work, they started praying 150 “Our Father’s” or “Hail Mary’s” instead. Beads were a convenient way to keep track of the prayers. The “Hail Mary” prayer seems to date back to the 2nd century as suggested by ancient Christian graffiti.

The Rosary as we have it today started to take shape in the 1200s through St. Dominic, the founder of the Order of Preachers or Dominicans. Since St. Dominic, the Dominicans have helped to spread devotion to Mary through the Rosary all over the world.

The word “Rosary” means “crown of roses” and is the most popular of many prayers involving repetition and beads (including the Divine Mercy chaplet). Some have accused the Rosary of being merely repetitious prayers. This neglects the fact that the prayers are merely a backdrop for meditating on the mysteries of Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection. Through the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious mysteries we are called to meditate on everything from Gabriel’s telling Mary she is to be the mother of Jesus to Mary being crowned Queen of Heaven. Our hope is to meditate on these holy mysteries so we can better know, love, and serve Jesus.

Great times to pray the Rosary are before Mass, while out on a walk, while riding in the car, or as a family in the evening. In the end, there are no bad times for the Rosary. Do we need to pray the Rosary to go to heaven? Of course not. We can never earn heaven. At the same time, outside of the Mass and the other Sacraments, the Rosary has been the most useful tool for bringing people to a closer relationship with Christ. Trying praying it regularly and you will find out why.

Mary, Mother of God and our patroness, pray for us.
