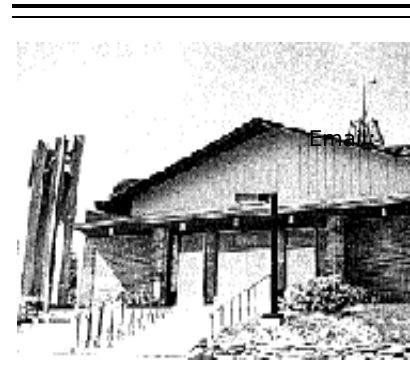

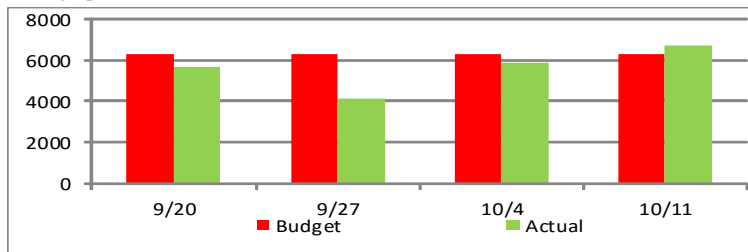

*News and Notes from the Pastor’s Desk*

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Personally, my mother is a breast cancer survivor, so this is very important to me. All of us should do what we can to end breast cancer and all forms of cancer, but also make sure we do so in ethical ways. With this in mind, here is a letter from the Nebraska Catholic Bishops:

“Breast cancer is the second most common form of cancer affecting women in the United States. As a result, few people are untouched by this serious disease and much attention is given, rightly, to a search for its cure. The most public effort is led by the Susan G. Komen for the Cure organization (Komen). Its work in the areas of breast cancer detection, prevention, and treatment is commendable.

Unfortunately, Komen’s good work is compromised by three of its policy positions. First, and of greatest concern, is Komen’s widely publicized decision to allow its state affiliates to provide grants to Planned Parenthood, which operates the largest abortion chain in the United States. Second, is Komen’s failure to definitively rule out the possibility of funding human embryonic stem cell research. Third, is Komen’s dismissal of research indicating a link between induced abortion and breast cancer.

Because of Komen’s policy positions, a Catholic institution or organization that endorses or partners with Komen could cause scandal or cooperate in morally unacceptable actions. Consequently, we ask Catholic institutions and organizations to find alternatives to Komen if they wish to raise funds for breast cancer research and/or programs. Among those alternatives are four Catholic hospitals in Nebraska that provide breast cancer services and two national groups that focus on breast cancer education and prevention. By providing funding for these alternatives, Catholics can still make a positive contribution toward fighting breast cancer without concern about compromising moral principles.
