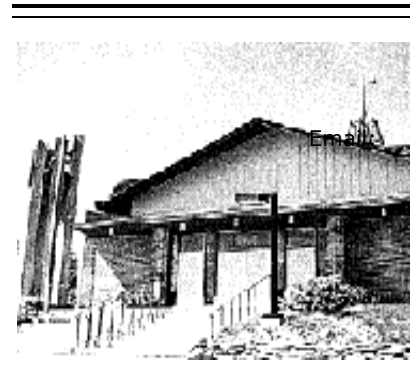

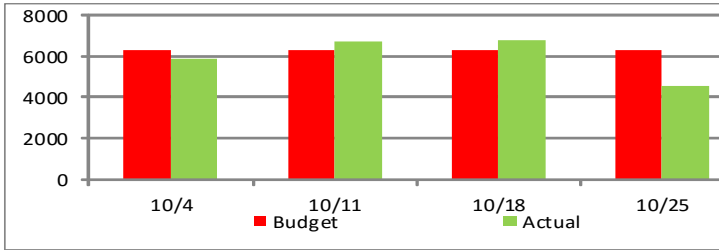

News and Notes from the Pastor's Desk

All throughout the month of November, we place the names of deceased loved ones in a book or in a basket. Those names are remembered at Masses all throughout November, a month that is dedicated to remembering and praying for the dead. The natural question is: Why do we pray for the dead?

Many non-Catholics do not pray for the dead, but only remember them. We pray for them because we believe in purgatory. You will not find the word “purgatory” anywhere in the Bible, but Christians have believed in it as long as Christianity has existed. Purgatory is for those who die in God’s friendship and are assured of salvation but who need to be purified from sin in order to enter heaven. There can be nothing bad in heaven. God is all good. He is goodness itself, so nothing evil can be in heaven where we are in God’s eternal presence. Logically, if we have small sins on our souls (not serious enough to deserve hell) we need to be purified (cleansed) of those sins so we can be completely good in heaven. The state of being cleansed by God from these sins is called purgatory (from the same root word as “purge” which means “to cleanse”).

Since all believers are connected in Christ, our prayers, fasting, and almsgiving are effective in helping others both in this life and in purgatory. The Sacrifice of the Mass is the preeminently way to pray for those who have died so that if they are in purgatory they may be helped by our prayers. If our loved ones are in heaven, then we ask them to pray for us. In Christ, the relationships we forge in this life do not end in death.

***The word “purgatory” is NOT explicitly in the bible, but we know that: **God is perfect holiness**---Isaiah 6:3 “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts!” **We are called to that same holiness**---Matt 5:48 “So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect.”

Without perfect holiness, we cannot see God in heaven---Rev 21:27 “nothing unclean will enter it [heaven]” **Atonement for the dead can be made by praying for them**---2 Macc12:44-46 “...he made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from this sin”

Mary, Mother of God and our patroness, pray for us.

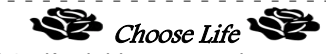
