

News and Notes from the Pastor's Desk

I saw stories of "Christians" criticizing Starbucks for having a plain red holiday cup, rather than a cup that is more explicitly about Christmas. I guess some people were critical because they felt like this was another attempt to take "Christ" out of "Christmas". Here are my thoughts, if you are interested:

I am someone who truly wants to "keep Christ in Christmas". One fear of mine is that people will forget that this time of year leading up to Christmas (Advent) is a time to prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus.

With that being said, here is why I disagree with those who criticize Starbucks:

Wanting Jesus to be the "reason for the season" does not give us an excuse to be overly critical, judgmental, or irrational. We can be strong in our faith without seeing every little thing, like a simple coffee cup, as an attack against Christianity.

When "Christians" do things like this, we hurt our chances with non-believers. Instead of being about the love and mercy of Jesus, we come across as being against small things that don't matter. If your first exposure to Christianity was through this controversy, would you want to become a Christian? I wouldn't.

Defending our faith is different from being defensive. It is good to defend our faith, but it should always be done in a loving way. Being defensive about our faith is totally different. It does not involve loving others, but only criticizing and putting them down. We are called to defend our faith but not to be defensive about it.

If we need to ridicule a company about a cup in order to protect Christmas, then we have a bigger problem than a cup. It is our joyful witness to the birth of Jesus and living the faith that will change hearts, draw people to Jesus and change the world. Getting angry over the design on a cup will do just the opposite.

Mary, Mother of Jesus, pray for us.


